| Say five words that begin with the same sound as cat. Then, say five words that end with the same sound. Finally say five words that rhyme with cat. <br> Adult Initial: | Bang and fang are in the same word family - they have the same ending pattern. Add more words to that family and then make word families for sing, kick, and junk <br> Adult Initial: | Reread a favorite story aloud. As you read, use a different voice for each character and the narrator (the voice telling the story). <br> Adult Initial: | Wave, yard, and ring are multiple meaning words. Draw a picture that shows two different meanings of each word. <br> Adult Initial: | Draw a picture of your favorite book character. | Some letter pairs sh, ch, th, and ck make one sound. Name as many words as you can think of with one or more pair! Adult Initial: | Go on an alphabet scavenger hunt. | Cat has three sounds - /c/, /a/, /t/. Read a book, pick five words from it, say each aloud, and count the number of sounds you hear. Try to beat your record! <br> Adult Initial: | Long, bouncy, furry, tiny, cold, flat, tall are all describing words. <br> Use them in a conversation with an adult about something living or nonliving. <br> Adult Initial: | Read a fantasy book and tell about the characters, where they live, and give details about the story events. |
| Play a word game with an adult. Come up with ten words and then give clues like, "I $\dagger$ begins with /r/ and rhymes with bug." See who guess the most!
